Elijah and the Still Small Voice

Background - 1 Kings 18: God just wrought an amazing victory on Mt Carmel, Fire came from heaven and Elijah thinks Israel will repent and turn to Yahweh. It appears that King Ahab is even convinced. It even rains. But now a devastating turn for the worse. One moment he is on an incredible high, then the next he is in the depths of depression. But God cares for him. God's love for Elijah helps him see what he should be doing for the ecclesia.

Moses and Elijah – A type of God's purpose with ourselves: Moses was a wonderful type of Christ. He made "atonement" for Israel's sin, Ex 32v30-32. He truly knew God, Psa 103v7-8. He was a wonderful shepherd of God's sheep, like Christ, Isa 63v11; Num 27v16-18. Elijah is a type of ourselves, of like passions as we are, Jms 5v17. We are striving to be like Christ, but all of us needing God to mould our characters along the way. It takes a lifetime and then immortality. God works with all of us during our lives to make us like Him. So too with Elijah.

Elijah learnt that he needed to develop relationships, to be a shepherd and a father, Isa 40v11. The only way to convince people of God's ways is by gentle persuasion. This is achieved by showing God's character, expressed in love: 1 Jn 4v12,16.

1 Kings 19: Elijah flees to Sinai v1-2 Jezebel threatens Elijah

v1 Ahab doesn't sav "prophets of Baal", because he is in Jezebel's presence. He also savs "all that Eliiah had done". Why not "that Yahweh had done"? Because he was fearful of his wife!

v2 This was shattering for Elijah. From an incredible high, he now reaches the depths of despair.

v3-8 Elijah flees into the desert

v3 The one time in Elijah's life that he was not directed by God's Word. He could have sought refuge in Gilead, and would have been safe there within 24hrs. But he was determined to go to Sinai because he knew its significance.

v4 Job was in a similar situation: Job 30v1-4. David also: Psa 120. Jesus was also in despair, but he was at one with his Father at all times. Jesus was also given an angel to help: Lk 22v43-44.

CHAPTER 19. z Elijah, threatened by Jezebel, fleeth to Beer-

sheba. 4 In the wilderness, being weary of his life, he is comforted by an angel. 15 God sendeth him to anoint Hazael, Jehu, and Elisha, 19 Elisha followeth Elijah AND Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done, and withal how he had #slain all the prophets with the sword. 2 Then Jezebel sent a messenger unto Elijah, saying, " So let the gods do to me, and more also, if I make not thy life as the life of one of them by to morrow about this time. 3 And when he saw that, he arose, and went for his life, and came to P Beer-sheba, which belongeth to Judah, and left his servant there.

4 ¶ But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a juniper tree: and he requested of for himself that he might die; and said. It is enough; now, O LORD, take

Moses and Elijah both went to Horeb: Moses experienced a 40 day fast before coming face to face with God. **Deut 9v9**. Both men learnt that man does not live by bread alone. Deut 8v3-5. Horeb was where Moses was given the law. **Deut 4v1-12: Heb** 12v18-21. The first time Horeb is mentioned is when Moses was tending sheep for 40yrs after similarly fleeing from Pharoah: Ex **3v1**. God was preparing Moses. Now God is preparing Elijah.

away my life; for I am not better than my fathers. 5 And as he lay and slept

under a juniper tree, behold. then an angel touched him, and said unto him, Arise and eat.

6 And he looked, and, behold. there was a cake baken on the coals, and a cruse of water at his 2 head. And he did eat and drink, and laid him down again.

7 And the angel of the LORD came again the second time, and touched him, and said, Arise and eat; because the journey is too great for thee. 8 And he arose, and did eat and drink, and went in the strength of that meat d forty days and forty nights unto "Horeb the mount of God. 9 ¶ And he came thither unto

a cave, and lodged there; and, behold, the word of the LORD came to him, and he said unto him, What doest thou here. Elijah?

10 And he said, I have been very hiealous for the LORD God of hosts: for the children of Israel have forsaken thy covenant. ⁱ thrown down thine altars, and ^{*i*}slain thy prophets with the sword; and ^{*i*}I, even I only, am left; and they seek my life, to take it away.

11 And he said, Go forth, and stand "upon the mount before the LORD. And, behold, the LORD passed by, and oa great and strong wind rent the mountains, and brake in pieces the rocks before the LORD; but the LORD was not in the wind: and after the wind an earthquake; but the LORD was not in the earthquake:

12 And after the earthquake a fire; but the LORD was not in the fire: and after the fire a ^rstill small voice.

13 And it was so, when Elijah heard it, that 'he wrapped his

Horeb = Mt Sinai

Being better than his fathers was not the point. It is not a matter of being better than anyone else.

v5 The angel touched him. Jesus touched people when he healed them to enter into their feelings. The angel was here to show love. care and to strengthen Elijah. Elijah needed to be like this.

v7 Angels rarely appeared during the "ministry of the prophets". The angel knew where Elijah was going. God knows all our plans and motives. He is waiting for us.

v8 40 days/nights represents our time of probation. Yahweh's angel came to "strengthen the things that remain that are ready to die": Rev 3v2. That's what Elijah should have been doing for the ecclesia.

v9-14 God questions Elijah

v9 Heb. "THE cave" - this was a specific cave, most likely where Moses had been when he made intercession for Israel: Ex 34v8-9. Elijah went there to make intercession against Israel: Rom 11v2-5. The emphasis is on the word "HERE" ie. "What are you doing in this place?" Elijah knew of Yahweh's awe-inspiring power at the time the law was given. He wanted to get into that cave and bring about judgment on Israel. He missed the point.

v10 The first time anyone in the Bible says the covenant name of God. Yahweh Elohim of Armies. This revealed Elijah's problem. God doesn't want to force people to love Him. God will not force Jewry to respond, but will write it in their hearts, in their inward parts: Jer 31v31-34. Elijah thought he was the only one left. He was badly mistaken. We need to be careful not to fall into this selfcentred way of thinking.

v13 The mantle was a symbol of being a prophet, 2 Kings 2v 13,15; Zech 13v4. It was God's voice that allured him out of the cave. That's what Eliiah will do in the future. Mal 4v4-6. God repeats what He said in v9. in effect asking Elijah what he is doing in this place, when the spirit of Moses was so different.

v14 Eliiah again uses God's militant title, repeating v10.

v15-18 God commands Elijah

v15-17 This would have been a real shock for Elijah. He thinks he is the only one left, yet God wants another man to take over. God's work was finished with Elijah for now.

v18 There is so much work for Elijah to do in the ecclesia. So too for ourselves.

to take it away. 15 And the LORD said unto him, Go, return on thy way to the wilderness of "Damascus: and when thou comest. hanoint Hazael to be king over Syria:

16 And ^k Jehu the son of Nim-shi shalt thou anoint to be king over Israel: and ²Elisha the son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah shalt thou anoint to be prophet in thy room.

17 And it shall come to pass, that him that escapeth the sword of "Hazael shall " Jehu slay: and him that escapeth from the sword of Jehu 'shall Elisha slay.

18 Yet 3 pI have left me seven thousand in Israel, all the knees which have not bowed unto Baal, and gevery mouth which hath not kissed him.

v11 Moses asked God to show him His ways, Ex 33v13. God's character was revealed to Moses in Ex 34v5-9. As a type of Christ, Moses prayed for God to forgive "our iniquity and our sin". He identified with those he came to save, like Christ: Matt 3v15.

Psalm 103v7,13 tells us that Moses understood what Israel didn't - that God is a Father: "He made known His ways unto Moses, his acts unto the children of Israel...Like as a father pitieth his children, so the LORD pitieth them that fear him." Israel saw God's acts, such as fire from heaven on Mt Carmel. Moses however knew God's character, expressed in the still small voice. Moses made intercession FOR Israel and He understood God's ways. This is what Elijah had to learn.

v12 Roth: "the voice of a gentle whisper". Zech 4v6: "not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the LORD of hosts." Jms 3v16-18: "easy to be entreated" ie. "winning its way by persuasiveness". See also Rom 2v4; 2 Cor 5v14; 10v1-2.
