James 1 - Endurance under trial

"In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. These have come so that your faith - of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire may be proved genuine and may result in praise, glory and honour when Jesus Christ is revealed." 1 Peter 1:6-7

v1-12 ENDURING UNDER THE TRIAL OF OUR FAITH

James immediately launches into the key issue here: Faith under trial. v1 James: A Greek form of Jacob. Jacob had 12 sons/tribes: Gen 49:28. Servant: Though James was the Lord's half brother, he does not base his authority on genealogy or position. A servant follows in the footsteps of Christ: Isa 42:1; 52:13; 53:11; Mk 9:35; Jn 13:14-17; 15:15,20; Phil 2: 7-8; 2 Tim 2:24. Twelve tribes: James writing to early Jewish ecclesias. **Scattered:** Gk. *diaspora*, ie. dispersed throughout the Roman Empire.

v2 Joy: Trial purifies us and reminds us of what is really important in life: Rom 8:18-19; 2 Cor 4:17; 1 Pet 1:6-7. This was taught and lived in the life of Christ: Matt 5:12; Heb 5:7-8; 12:2. Think about the context of Jesus' words about joy: Jn 15:7-13; 16:20-24; 17:13. Key verses: 1 Jn 1:4; 2 Jn 1:12; 3 Jn 1:4; Phil 1:4,18,25; 2:8-9,16-18; 3:1; 4:4. Our hope inspires joy in us: Mt 13:20,44; 25:21; Heb 12:2. God's Kingdom is a place of amazing joy: Isa 12:3; 35:2,10; 51:3,11; 55:12; 65:18-19.

v2 Temptations: Also 1:12 and 1 Pet 1:6; 4:12; 2 Pet 2:9; 1 Tim 6:9. Used in the context of being put to the proof by trial, also being enticed. The antidote to temptation is in 1 Tim 6:11. The solution is to fill our lives with the positive aspects of the gospel: Rom 13:14; Gal 5:16.

v3 Trying of faith: To partake in Christ's sufferings: 1 Pet 4:11-16. Faith is tested over a lifetime: Mt 10:22. Faith is like the refining of gold, it develops character and perseverance: Job 23:10; Prov 17:3; 1 Pet 1:7. It is through much tribulation that we enter the Kingdom: Isa 48:10; Mal 3:3; Acts 14:22; 2 Cor 1:4; Rev 2:10. v4 Patience: A fundamental principle! See Jas 5:7-11. Emphasised 7x in Revelation: Rev 1:9; 2:2,3, 19: 3:10: 13:10: 14:12. It is the hardest lesson for us to learn. A constant theme in Scripture for faithful saints eg. Lk 8:15; Rom 2:7; 5:3-4; 8:25. Perfect and entire: NIV "mature and complete", tr. accomplish in Lk 9:31. God is working with us over time to develop our characters: Phil 1:6. This concept is seen in the burnt offering which was entirely consumed: Lev 1:9, and ultimately fulfilled in Christ: Eph 5:2.

v5 Lack: same in Gk. as wanting in v4 - a connecting thought. Wisdom: The practical application of knowledge, explained in Jas 3:13-17 and emphasised over 50x in Proverbs. Key verses: Prov 2:1-8. Liberally: unreserved, whole-hearted, free from division of motive and loyalty. In **Eph 6:5** servants serve in *singleness* of heart (same Greek word). Upbraideth not: NIV "without finding fault" v6 Nothing wavering: ie. "not doubting" Wave of the sea: symbolic Gentile nations that rage: Isa 57: 20-21. Think about the lesson of Peter walking on water in Mt 14:28-30.

v8 Double minded man: opposite to the single-mindedness of God. It is serving 2 masters: Mt 6:24. Halting between 2 opinions: 1 Kings 18:21. In Lk 17:26-28 Jesus warns it is easy to be like this in the last days. Now James deals with the greatest cause of double-mindedness in 1:10. v9 Rejoice: literally means to glory or be exalted. Godliness with contentment is great gain: 1 Tim 6:6. See also Eccl 5:15; 2 Cor 12:9-10; Phil 4:11-13; Heb 13:8. Financial gain now is incomparable to eternity. The gospel is a free gift: Isa 55:1: Acts 8:20: 1 Pet 5:2. The great challenge through the ages has been to see beyond the present. To trust in things not seen, to look for a future reward: Heb 11:6,13,39-40. Job understood this principle: Job 1:21. In Lk 12:15-22 Jesus says our life does not consist of material things. The poor brother takes comfort in that he will inherit the Kingdom: Lk 6:20; Jas 2:5. Rich and poor can both be preoccupied with money: Prov 30:8-9. v10 Rich: the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil: 1 Tim 6:10. All flesh is grass - a symbol taken from Isa 40:6-7 and Psa 103:15. v11 Burning heat: literally means a "scorching wind" as in Job 27:21; Jer 18:17; Hos 13:15. v12 Endure temptation: particularly trials in this context. Crown of life: Stephanos, the wreath of victory, as in the games: 1 Cor 9:25; 2 Tim 4:8; Rev
