James 2 - Show me your faith

v1-13 WARNING AGAINST FAVOURITISM

James now continues his emphasis on pure and undefiled religion (from 1:27). He shows how inconsistent it is with the gospel to show favouritism. NIV "My brothers, as believers in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ, don't show favouritism"

v1 Faith of our Lord Jesus Christ: He immediately brings to their attention the life of their Lord as an example. Christ is "the glory" because he perfectly reflected the character of his Father: Isa 40:5; Jn 1:14. Jesus did not favour the rich: Mt 19:23-26; Lk 6:24. He taught that we should care for the poor: Lk 14:7-14. **Respect of persons:** Do we show favouritism in the ecclesia to our family and close friends? Or those who may favour us in return? Do we give thought to the lonely in our youth group or those who are different to us? Are we prejudiced against certain families or ecclesias? If so, then this exhortation is for us. We cannot claim to have the faith of Christ if we show partiality: 1 Tim 5:21; Jas 3:17. Read Principles & Proverbs page 36.

v2: Your assembly: The word is not ecclesia (as in 5:14) but synagogue. They were acting like Scribes and Pharisees. In 2:3 he refers to seats in the synagogues: Mt 23:2,6. A gold ring was a symbol of distinction. v3 Footstool: He uses *irony* in alluding to Psa 110:1; Isa 66:1,2. v4 Partial: Same word tr. Waver*ing* in **1:6**. The idea of division. Judges of evil thoughts: Gk. evil thinking judges. Contrast to the judgment of Christ in the Kingdom: Isa 11:3,4. Subsequent verses down to 2:13 speak of God's judgment. Jesus Christ

z It is not agreeable to Christian profession to regard the rich, and to despise the poor: 13 but rather to be loving, and merciful: 14 not to boast of faith where no deeds are, 17 which is but a dead faith, 19 the faith of devils, ar not of Abraham, &c.

is the true iudge: Jas 4:12: 5:9: 2 Tim 4:8. It is human reasoning to label bro's/sis's and ecclesias "into boxes". So often our judgment is based on flawed information anyhow. We will be judged with the severity that we have judged others: Mt 7:1-5.

v5 Beloved brethren: He rebukes his readers vet constantly tempers this with a term of affection to show that he cares. God: Emphasis in Greek is on "God" cp. "ye" in 2:6. Heirs of Kingdom: Mt 25:34; Rom 8:17; Tit 1:2; Jas 1:12; 1 Jn 2:25; Rev 3:21. God's Kingdom is a pearl of great price: Mt 13:46; Mk 10:30; Rom 2:7. Green text is in parenthesis. If God has chosen each one of us above those important in this world, then how can we despise someone else whom God has chosen? A character "poor in spirit" is fit for the Kingdom: Mt 5:3; Isa 66: 1,2. Rich in faith: Isa 55:1; Rev 2:9; 3:17-18.

v6 Despised: Christ was despised: Isa 53:3. He also was taken to judgment: Jn 19:13. So too were the apostles: Acts 16:19. Rich: The earliest persecution came from wealthy Sadducees, the priesthood: Acts 4:1-7; 5:17. v7 Blaspheme: Punished by death under the law: Ex 20:7; Lev 24:10-16. A serious mistake to cause unbelievers to blaspheme: 2 Sam 12:14; Rom 2: 23-24; Tit 2:5. v8 Royal law: Lev **19:18** Upon this hangs all the law and prophets: Mt 22:36-40.

v9 Respect persons: Significantly this is also in the law: Lev 19:15. Remember he is speaking to Jews.

v10-11 Guilty of all: Law centred around 2 principles - love God and our neighbour: Mt 22:36-40; 1 Jn 4:19-21; Ecc 12:13. v12 NIV "speak and act as those who are going to be judged by the law that gives freedom". Law of Liberty: Jas 1:25. Freedom from condemnation: **Rom** 8:1-2. But not a licence to sin: Tit 2:11-12. Being in Christ frees us from the curse: Rom 6:4-6: Gal 2: 20. v13 Mercy: NIV "because judgment without mercy will be shown to anyone who has not been merciful. Mercy triumphs over judgment!" cp. Mt 7:1-5. Mercy and judgment are opposites yet form God's character: Ex 34:6-7; Rom 11:22. In the life of Jesus we see the perfect blend of these: Ps 85: 10; Jn 1:14. If we judge ourselves whilst being merciful to others, we will be shown mercy: 1 Cor 11:28-**31**. At the judgment, mercy triumphs due to mercy we showed others.

v14-17 FAITH WITHOUT WORKS IS DEAD

v14 NIV "Can that faith save him?" Like Paul, James believes that we are justified by faith. James is saying that real faith is more than just giving lip service to a set of doctrinal beliefs. Jesus taught the same in Mt 7:21-24. In Heb 11 we read how that faith was a powerful force in the lives of the faithful - it produced action in the most trying of circumstances. In **1 John** we read of 7 tests of true discipleship: 1 Jn 1:6,8,10; 2:4,6,9; 4:20. We must live what we believe not just talk about it. Faith is tested to show that it is genuine. James 2:14-17 is closely connected to 2:1-13. v15-16 The practical issues of life. See Mt 25:32-45; Acts 11:28-29; Rom 15:26.

v20 The 2nd time for emphasis (1st in 2:17, 3rd in 2:26) v21 Abraham: He is the father of the Jews so what better example to use to these Jews. Also the father of the faithful: Rom 4:12; Gal 3:7-9. Justified is to be considered perfect. God looks on us as if we are perfect, even though we are not. This was not merely actions in obedience to a command. It was motivated by the promise that God would provide: Rom 4:12-25. Abraham believed in God's power to raise Isaac: Heb 11:17-19. James refers to Gen 22:16,18 "because you have obeyed"

v22 Wrought: Gk. fellow-worker, energetic co-operation. Gal 5:6 "Faith expressing itself through love". Made perfect: Faith in the promise of a seed was the *motive force* behind offering Isaac: Gen 15:4-6. Faith matured or literally was brought to completion. In Heb 6:13-15 we see a working together of faith and patient endurance. v23 Scripture: Gen 15:6, with Gen 22 being the completion of a process. Cited also in Gal 3:6; Rom 4:3. The justified live by Faith: Hab 2:4; Rom 1:17; Gal 3:11; Heb 10:38. Friend of God: Also in 2 Chron 20:7; Isa 41:8. James was writing to some who were friends of the world: 4:4.

v24 NIV "a person is justified by what he does and not by faith alone". Obedience is fundamental, not an optional extra: 1 Sam 12:15; 15: 19; Heb 11:4-7. Sadly, "salvation by faith alone" is the catchery of many "Christians" today. v25 Rahab: Contrast with Abraham to show that this is a universal principle. She was the lowest of Gentiles, but faith triumphed: Rom 3:29-30. Many in the land believed but she acted: Josh 2:9-16; 5:1; Heb 11:31. v26 Spirit: Breath ie. LIFE!
