James 4 - Humility and Submission

4v1-5 WARS AND FIGHTING INCONSISTENT WITH OUR CALLING:

James 4:1-5 is now the climax of his condemnation. He strikes right at the heart of the problem. Envy and strife in the ecclesia and between individuals is shown for what it is. The combatants may dress it up with smooth words of justification, but the reality is as James states it - it is "war". He even calls it "the devil". The teachings of Christ are so opposite to what was happening amongst believers. Matt 26:52: "all they that take the sword shall perish with the sword." cp. Rev 13:10. Jn 18:36: "If my kingdom were of this world, then would my servants fight." 1 Pet 3:15-17: "It is better, if it is God's will, to suffer for doing good than for doing evil."

Lessons for us: In Mt 24:49 Jesus warns of the last days where evil servants smite their fellowservants. A careful comparison with Matt 18: **28-33** reveals this to be a reference to a brother refusing to forgive his fellowservant and who acts in hostility towards him. This is no doubt why we have the reference in **James 5:11** to Job who prayed for his friends despite their failings. James concludes (in 5:17-21) with Elijah and the principle of praying for our brethren and hiding a multitude of sins.

v1-5 Wars and Fightings: Anyone who says he is in the truth but hates his brother is actually in darkness: 1 Jn 2:9-11. Cain hated his brother Abel: Gen 4:8; 1 Jn 3:12-15. Jesus however, loved his enemies: Mt 5:44; Lk 23:34; Jn 13:35. A careful read of 1 Cor 13 and 2 Tim 3:1-13 reveals some remarkable contrasts. We learn in Psa 133 and Jn 17 that unity is a precious thing to maintain. Disunity and division is a serious error: Prov 6: 19: Rom 16:17: 1 Cor 1:10-13: 3:3-6 James shows how worldly influences (the earthly wisdom of 3:15-16) were affecting their relationships. The competitiveness, self-indulgence and materialism in our world can have a deceptive influence on ecclesial life and on how we interact with others.

v1 War in your members: Symbol of baser lusts in conflict with the mind. The same principle is in Rom 7:23 in the context of Paul's battle between the thinking of the flesh and of the spirit: Rom 7:20-8:17. The carnal mind and the spiritual mind are at enmity with one another as a result of the sin in Eden: Gen 3:15. v2-3 Lust: The 3 lusts of 1 Jn 2:15-16 are also unrestrained in the last days we live in: Lk 17:26-30; 2 Tim 3:1-7. Their prayers were self-indulgent. Compare this with the prayers of Elijah and Job: 5:11,17-20. See the Background and Overview notes.

CHAPTER 4. r We are to strive against covetousness, 4 intemperance, 5 pride, 11 detraction, &c.: 13 and, mindful ever of the uncertainty of this

life, to commit ourselves and all our affairs to God's providence. **C**ROM whence come wars and ⁴fightings among you? come they not hence, even of your ⁷ lusts ¹ that war in your

members? 2 Ye lust, and have not: ve ⁹kill, and desire to have, and cannot obtain: ye fight and war, yet ye have not, because ve ask not.

3 Ye ask, and receive not, ⁿ because ye ask amiss, that ye may consume it upon your lusts. Not in the original Greek text

4 ^p Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that ⁹ the friendship of the world is enmity with God? 'whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God.

5 Do ye think that 'the scripture saith in vain. ^t The spirit that dwelleth in us lusteth * to envy?

6 But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, "God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble. 7 Submit yourselves therefore

to God. * Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

8 Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you. ^a Cleanse your hands, ye sinners; and ^b purify your hearts, ye ^c double minded

9 Be afflicted, and e mourn, and weep: let your laughter be turned to mourning, and your joy to heaviness.

v2-3 NIV "You want something but don't get it. You kill and covet, but you cannot have what you want. You guarrel and fight. You do not have, because you do not ask God. When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures." Jesus Christ prayed "not my will but thine be done" Lk 22:42. Our prayers must be according to the will of Christ and through his name: Jn 14:12-14; 1 Jn 5:14. Prayers not acknowledging God's will may result in God giving what we ask, with disastrous results: Psa106:14-15. v4 The world: Defined in 1 Jn 2:15-17. Overcoming the world involves tribulation, but believers overcome by faith knowing Christ has already overcome on our behalf: Jn 16:33: 1 Jn 5:4. He overcomes the world because he is the lamb - one who is submissive to God's will: Mt 26:39; Rev 7:13-17; 13:8; 17:14. Overcoming the world is the goal of those promised the Kingdom in the 7 letters: Rev 2:7.11.17.26: 3:5.12.21: 21:7. The final victory of those who overcome the world is in Rev 11:15; 15:2. Enmity: Gen 3:15 Two opposing forces in this struggle: 1. Seed of the serpent: Those ruled by the natural impulses of human nature and who challenge God's Word, and 2. Seed of the woman: Those transformed by God's Word.

v4 Friendship with the world: Spiritual adultery: 2 Cor 11:2-3. This is the double-mindedness of 1:8. See notes on 1:8.14. No man can serve 2 masters: Mt 6:24. Eliliah cried, "How long will you go limping between 2 different opinions? If the LORD is God, follow him: but if Baal, then follow him" 1 Kgs 18:21. James uses Elijah in his conclusion: 5:17-20. Jezebel is a symbol of unfaithfulness by bringing the world into the ecclesia: Rev 2:20-22.

v5 ESV "Do you suppose it is to no purpose that the Scripture says, He yearns jealously over the spirit that he has made to dwell in us?" Not a direct quote but an overall summary of Ex 20:5; 34:13-16; Zech 1:14; 8:2. They were acting as if they didn't believe God's words. Separation from the world is a consistent principle: Gen 3:15; Dan 4: 17; Rom 8:7; 12:2; 1 Pet 2:9; 2 Cor 6:14-7:1; 1 Jn 2:15.

> Envy: Caused the Jews to deliver up Christ to be crucified: Mt 27: 18. Envy, strife causes division: Rom16:17;1Cor1:10; 3:3;11:18.

v6-10 THE SOLUTION IS HUMILITY AND SUBMISSION

v6 Grace: Citation from Prov 3:34. God's grace is conditional on repentance: Isa 55:6-7; Acts 3:19. Proud: See notes on Jas 3:5. Humble: Isa 57:15; 66:2; Mt 5:3-5; Mk 10:15; Col 3:12; 1 Pet 3:4. v7 The devil: Symbol of fleshly human desires: Mt 13:19,39; Jn 8: 44; 1 Jn 2:13-14. 1 Jn 3:8. Jesus "destroyed the works of the devil." He defeated sin on our behalf. We must also flee temptation: 1 Cor 6:18; 10:14; 1 Tim 6:11; 2 Tim 2:22. Submit: Mt 5:38-45; Rom 6:13. Christ was the ultimate example of submission to his Father's will - the lamb: Lk 23:46; Jn 10:15-17; Rev 5:8-9. We must also be submissive to rulers and each other: 1 Pet 2:13; 5:5-7. v8 Purify: Mt 5:8 "Blessed are the pure in heart". God's Word is what purifies us: Jn 17:19; 2 Cor 7:1; Jms 4:8; 1 Pet 1:22.

v9 James exhorts us to expend energy in considering our position before God. Once humbled, we are in a state where God can work with us: Psa 18:24-27: 119:67.71: Dan 4:33-37: Joel 2:13.

10 ^a Humble yourselves in the v10 Principle from Prov 18:12. sight of the Lord, and he shall Meditate upon Psalm 73 in the lift you up.

11 Speak not evil one of another, brethren. He that speaketh evil of his brother, and ^e judgeth his brother, ^J speaketh evil of the law, and judgeth the law: but if thou judge the law, thou art not a doer of the law, but a judge.

12 There is one lawgiver, who is able to save and k to destroy: ^m who art thou that judgest another?

We will see in James 5 that the solution to all these problems is found in the lives of Job and Elijah: Prayer, forgiveness and allowing God to shape our characters in the experiences of life.

context of James 4:1-10. v11-12PRESUMPTIOUS JUDG-MENTS: Emphasis on brother / brethren - Same as in 1 Jn 3: **10-17**. That example is Cain and Abel. Abel is not mentioned by name, but "his brother". The

issue here is the same - love for the brethren. Those of the devil follow in the footsteps of Cain. See also Mt 7:1-5: Rom 2:1.

v13-17 WARNING AGAINST **PRESUMPTIOUS SPEAKING:** Jesus taught this principle: Mt 6: shall be on the morrow. For 25-34; Lk 12:22-31. "Do not what is your life? ³ It is even boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may bring": Prov 27:1. Prayer should 15 For that ye ought to say, "If be an important part of our lives. venture is subject to God's will. Lk 18:1; Acts 21:14; Phil 4:6; 1 Jn 5:14-15. v16 Boastings: **Prov 27:1**. Only other occurrence of Gk is 1 Jn 2:16 "pride of life".
